- Attend EMT-Basic classes as well as Paramedic School

REQUIREMENTS

To apply for an opportunity to become a cadet, the following requirements must be met:

- Be between the ages of seventeen (17) and nineteen (19) to apply. Applicant must be at least eighteen (18) years of age at the time of hire.
- Have graduated from an accredited high school, have attained senior class standing, GED or Home School Certification at time of written test
- Have a minimum high school grade point average of 2.50 on a 4.00 scale or equivalent
- Possess a valid State of Illinois Class D Driver's License.
 Must be able to acquire a Non-Commercial Class B
 Driver's License.
- · Be a U.S. Citizen at time of hire
- Possess a desire to pursue a career in the Fire and EMS Profession
- · Possess excellent moral character

- · A visual and physical examination
- · An oral interview
- · An extensive background investigation
