Some top key skills of Emergency Managers include:

- Communication: clearly convey plans and actions both orally and written
- Critical-Thinking: anticipate hazards and problems in order to respond and recover effectively
- Decision Making: analyze and choose among many options, often in stressful situations
- Interpersonal: work with and coordinate the work of a wide range of organizations and people
- Leadership: influence and guide others through training and action

While there are no statutory qualifications to be an emergency manager, it is highly suggested you plan your career path with the following information to make you stand out from other applicants.



Emergency Management is not a one size fits all profession, and to stay current you need to seize opportunities, network, and read - lots of reading! By doing these three steps you will strengthen your abilities and maintain professional resilience.



You are sure to stand out from the rest if you take the time to volunteer. Consider volunteering with an emergency management agency or humanitarian or disaster response and relief agencies to gain valuable knowledge and skills



Formal training is one of the top qualifications required. One of the easiest ways to get free training is through FEMA online courses. Aim to have 100 hours of generic management courses and 100 hours of emergency management courses.



Having a university qualification in emergency management is a growing trend. 57% have a bachelor's, 20% have an associate's, and only 4% percent have a high school diploma. Choose a university program that offers a diverse program focused on current and emerging trends in emergency management.
