Aurora Police Investigate Second Friday Shooting Incident

On May 15, at approximately 3:44 p.m., Aurora Police officers responded to reports of a gunshot victim in the 1100 block of Bonner Avenue.

Upon arrival, officers located a 45-year-old male suffering from a non-life-threatening gunshot wound inside a residence in the 1100 block of Bonner Avenue. Officers immediately rendered aid, including the application of a tourniquet, until Aurora Fire Department paramedics arrived and transported the victim to a local hospital for treatment of his injuries.

Initial information indicates he may have been injured during a shooting incident that occurred in the surrounding neighborhood before seeking help at a nearby residence, where officers ultimately located him.

Detectives from the Aurora Police Department's Investigations Bureau responded to investigate the circumstances surrounding the incident. Evidence Technicians processed multiple locations in the area and collected forensic evidence.

Detectives continue to canvass the neighborhood and review surveillance footage as the investigation remains ongoing. At this time, no suspects are in custody.

Based on the preliminary investigation, this appears to be an isolated incident and there is no known ongoing threat to the general public.
